Acorn Hall is a well-preserved example of Victorian Italianate style residence built in 1853. It is currently owned by the Morris County Historical Society (MCHS) and operated as a historic house museum. Major restoration work was completed in 1995.

The 2003 grant funded the scraping and repainting of the exterior.

Two 2010 grants have helped provide for the stabilization of the 1860 dining room bay window, as well as the completion of a Preservation Plan for Acorn Hall, the Carriage House and site.

A 2011 grant provided for the preparation of a Landscape Plan.

The 2012 grant has provided for exterior restoration including the restoration of the flat-seam metal roofing at the porches and gift shop, and the repair and restoration of the gutters and leaders at the Main Building and East Wing.

The 2013 grant helped install interior storm windows. A separate grant completed a paint test on the east elevation. The 2015 grant completed roofing restoration.

The 2016 and 2017 grants assisted with exterior restoration including foundation stabilization, tower reroofing, painting to restore 1860's-1880's appearance, site drainage and interior plaster restoration.

The 2022 grant will assist with stabilization of outbuilding foundations including installation of brick, repointing, and applying a mortar wash.
