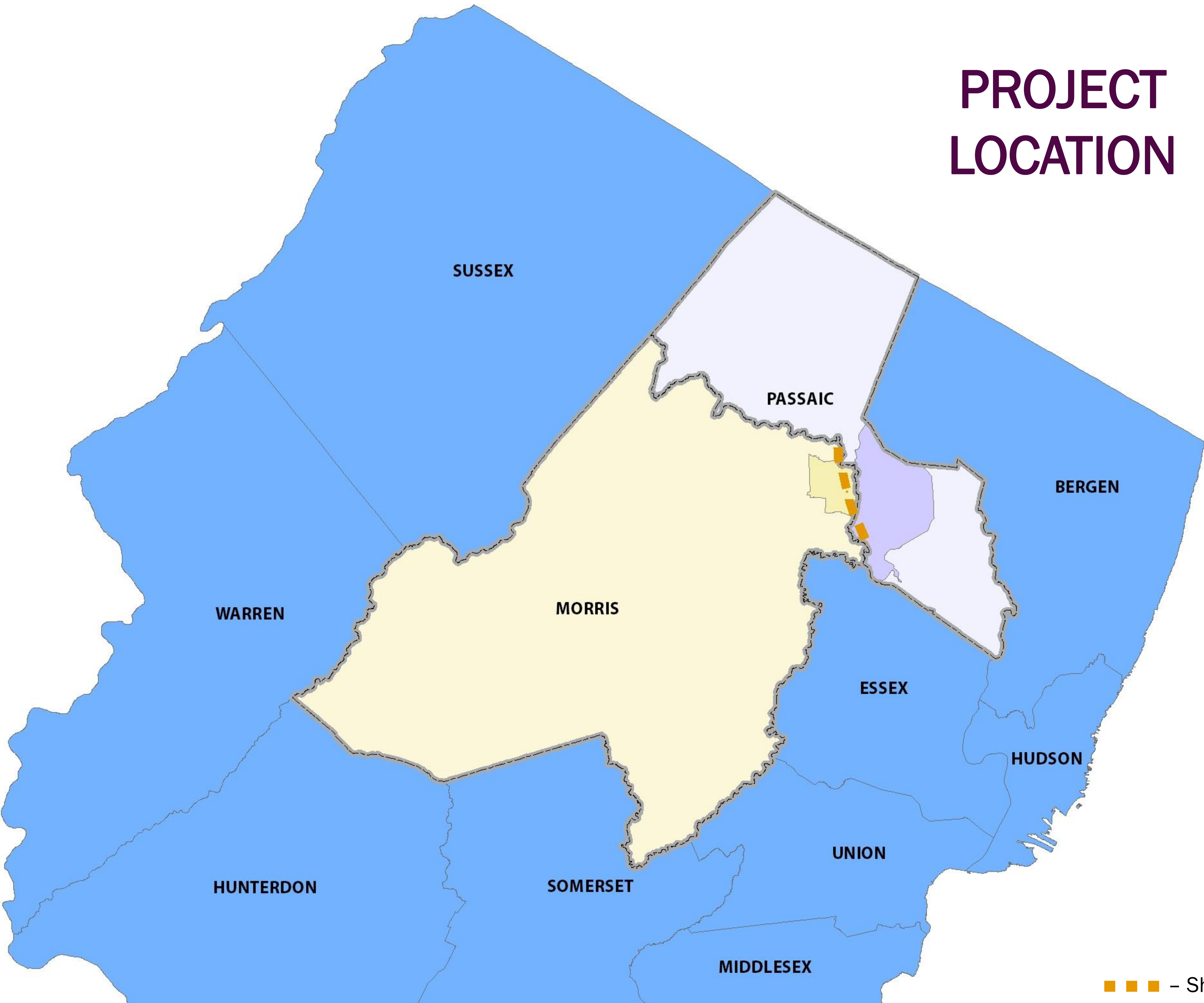

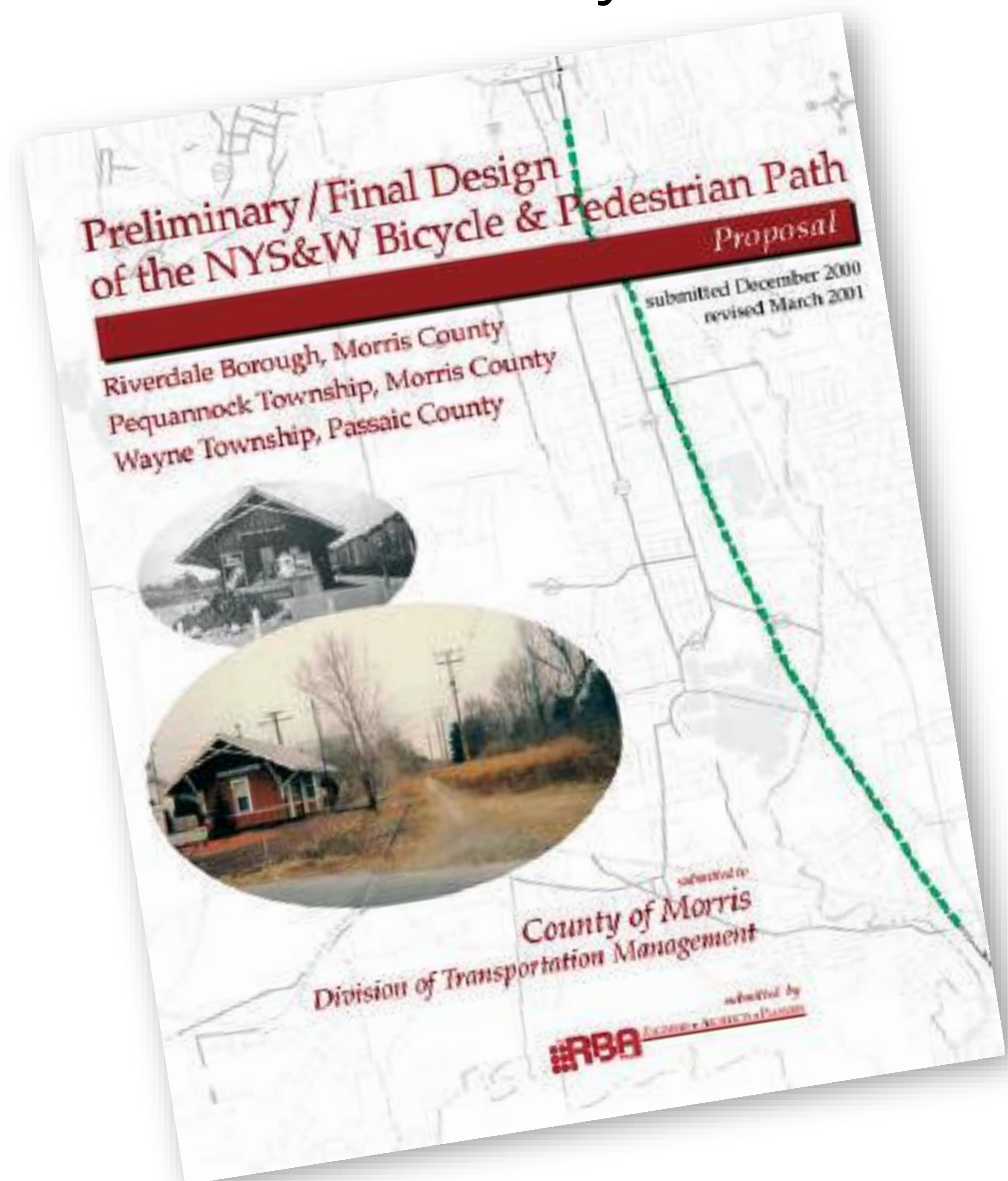
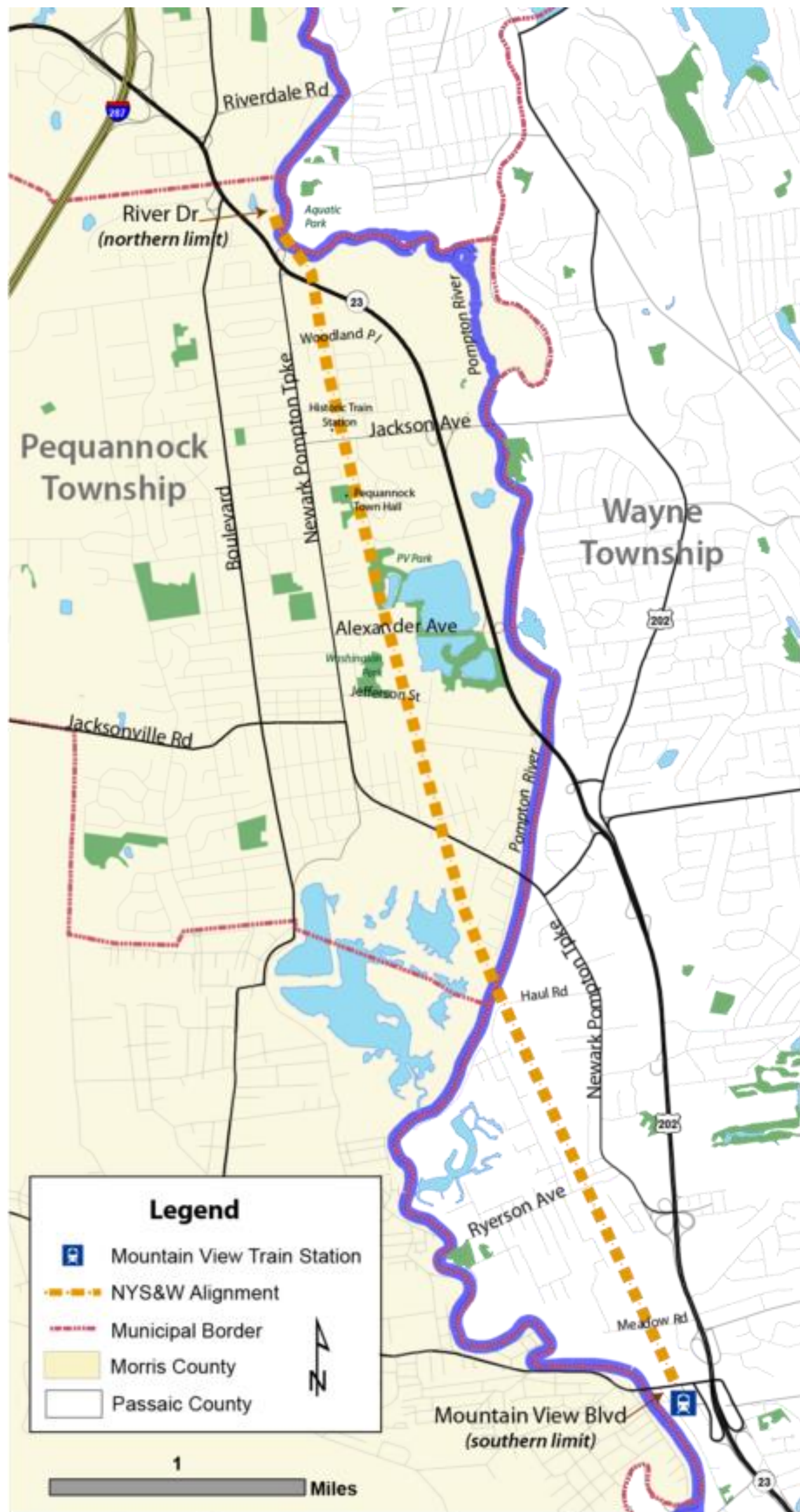
PROJECT LOCATION

Morris County Receives a STBGP Grant from NJTPA to Assess the Feasibility of Constructing a Shared Use Path Along the NYS&W Railway Corridor



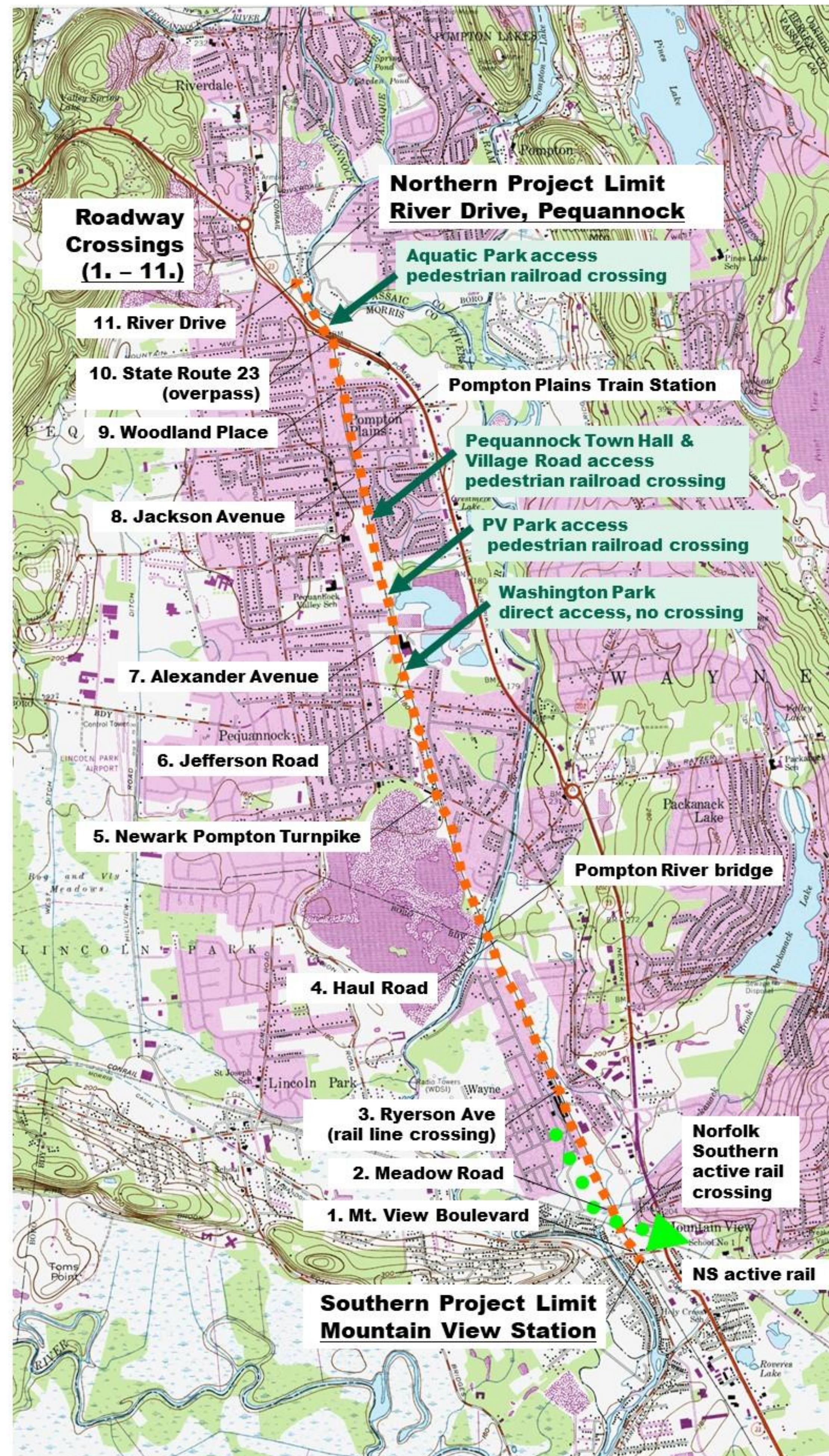

The NYS&W Bicycle and Pedestrian Path Location and Key Elements Map

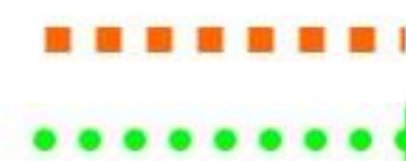

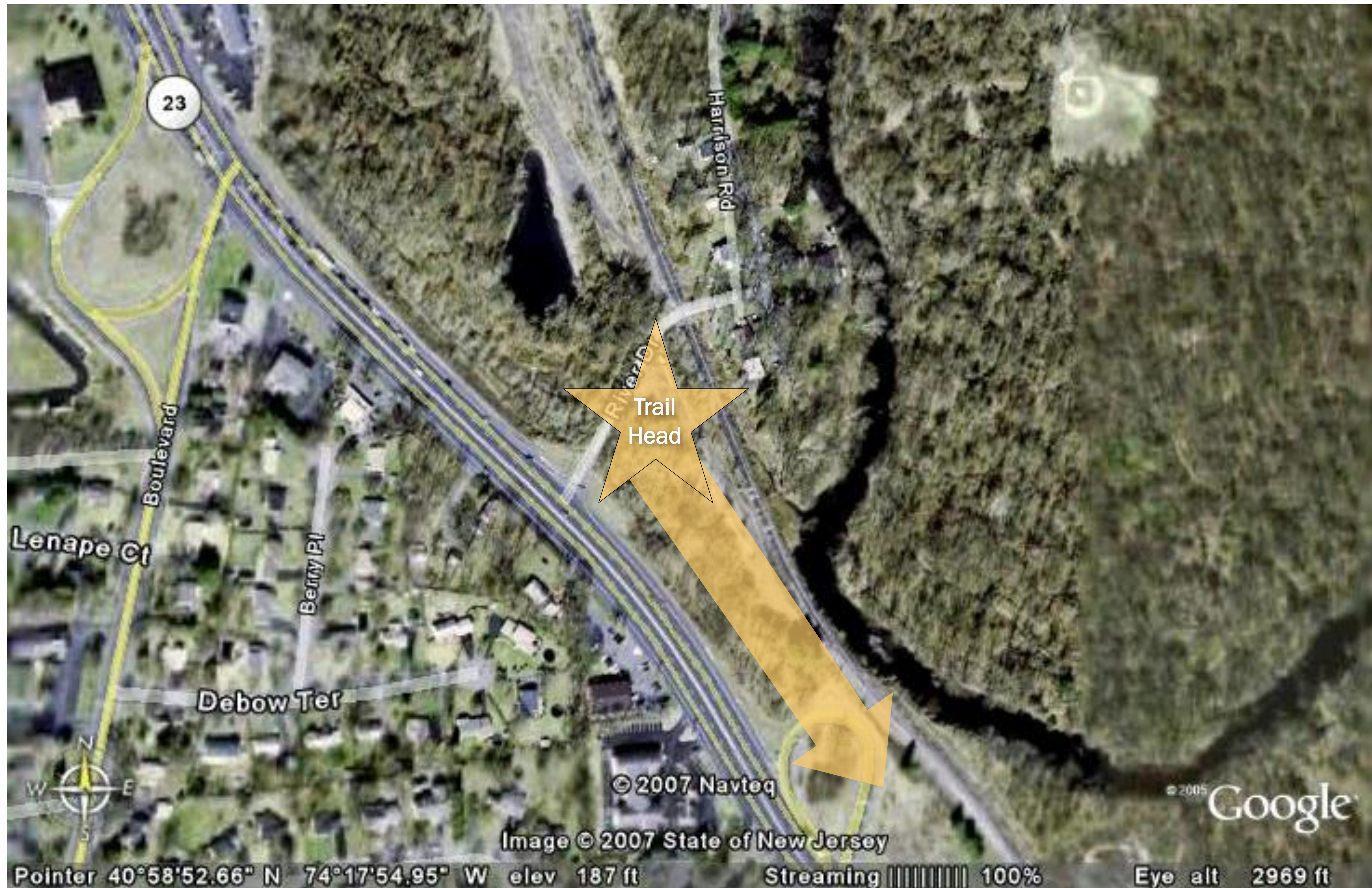

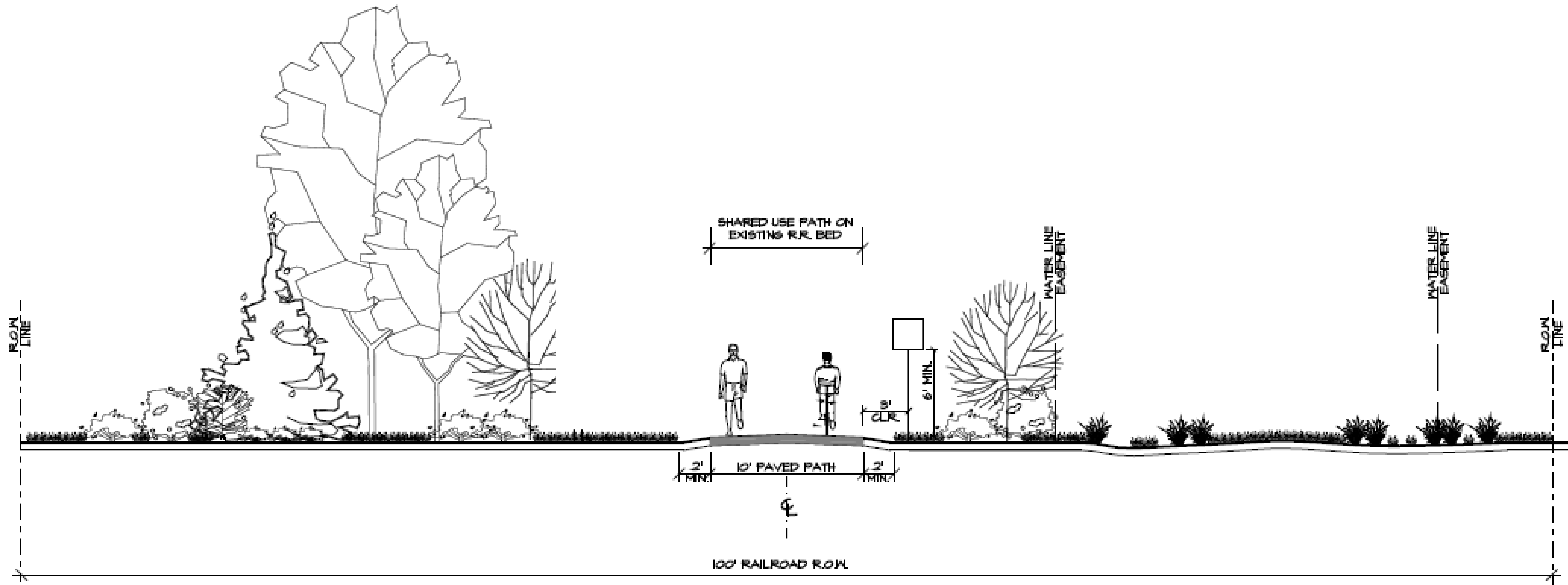

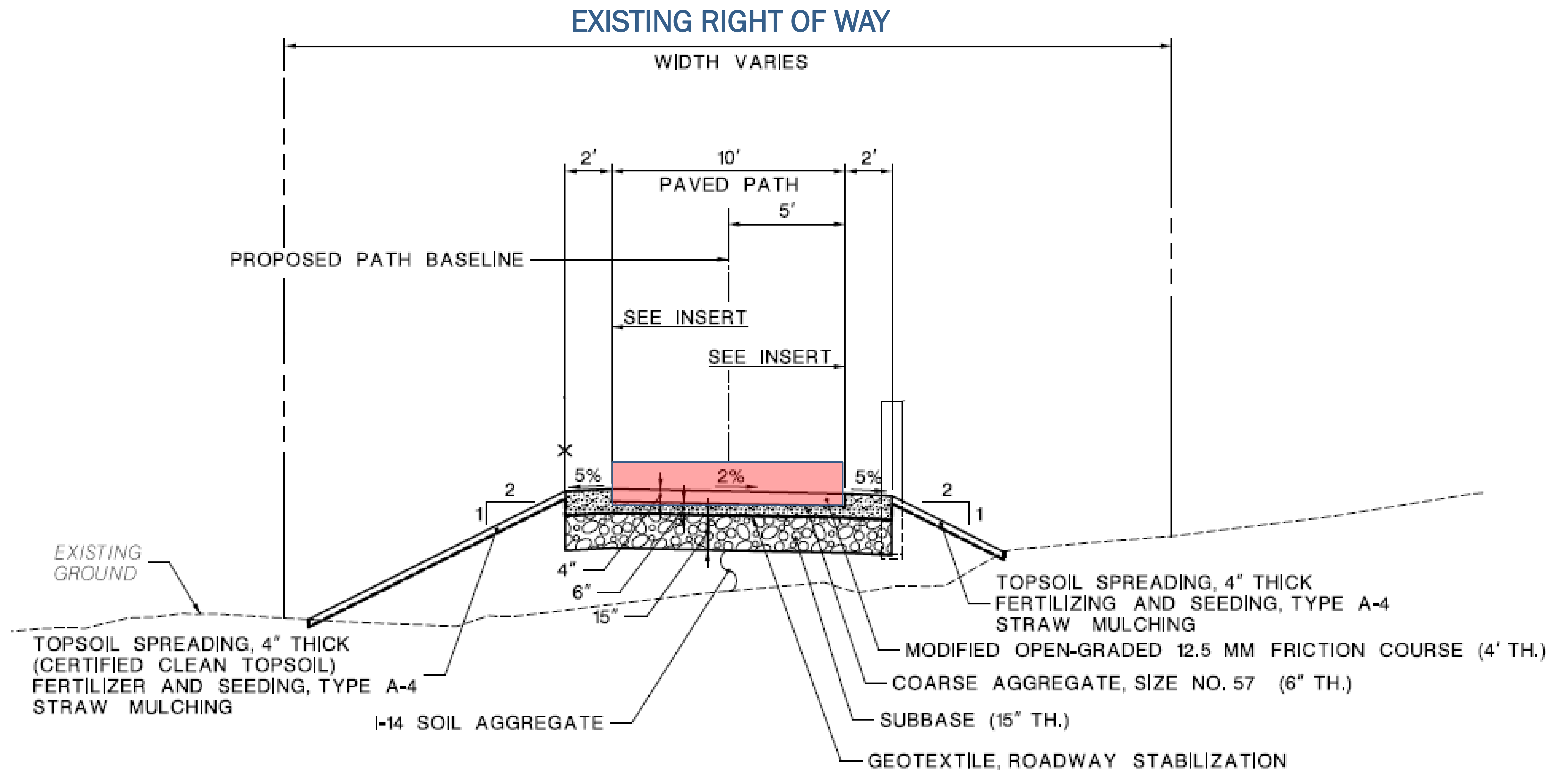


TYPICAL CROSS SECTION

The Path will be 10 feet Wide between the Edges of Pavement



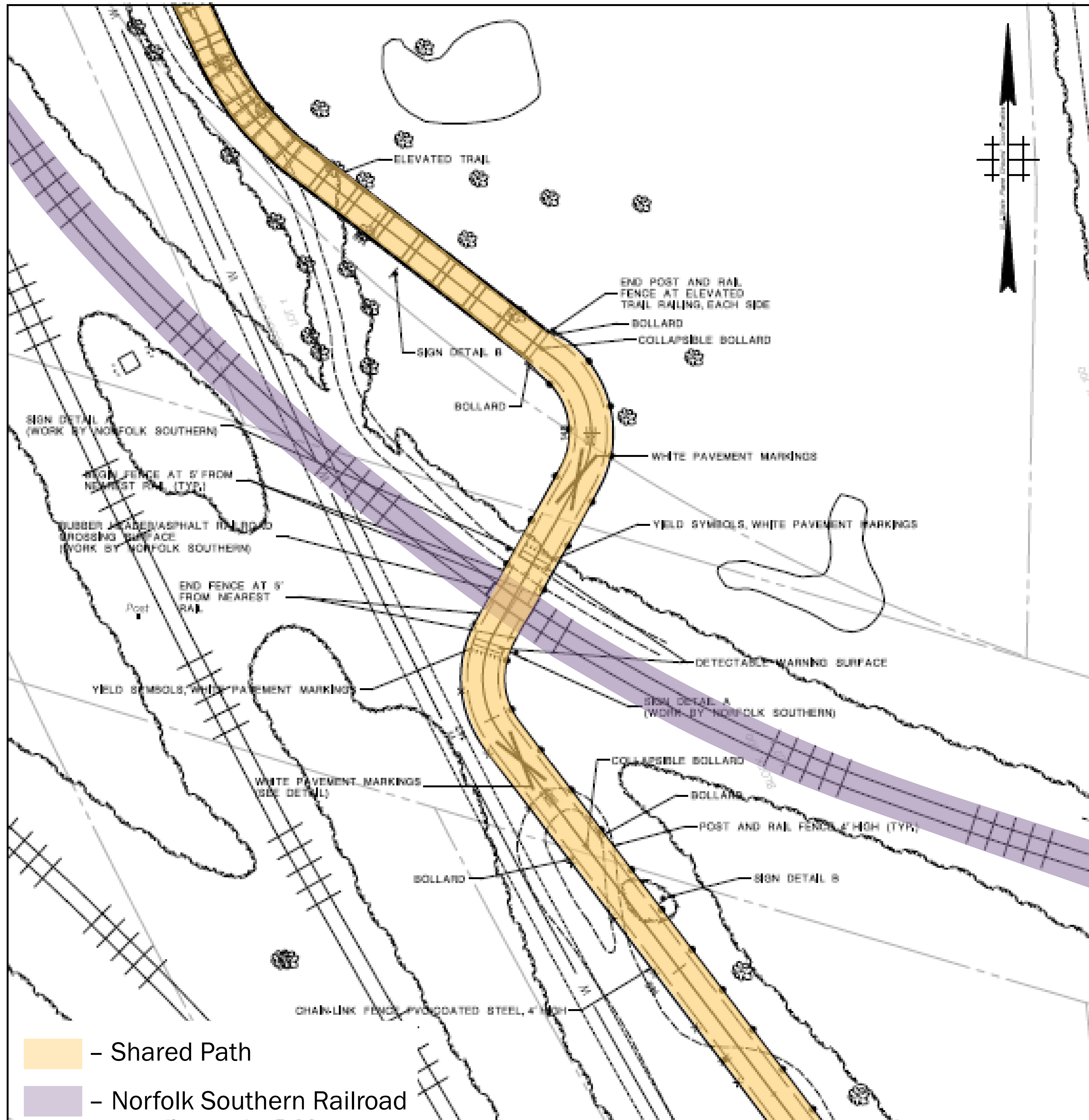
Typical Cross Section View of the Path

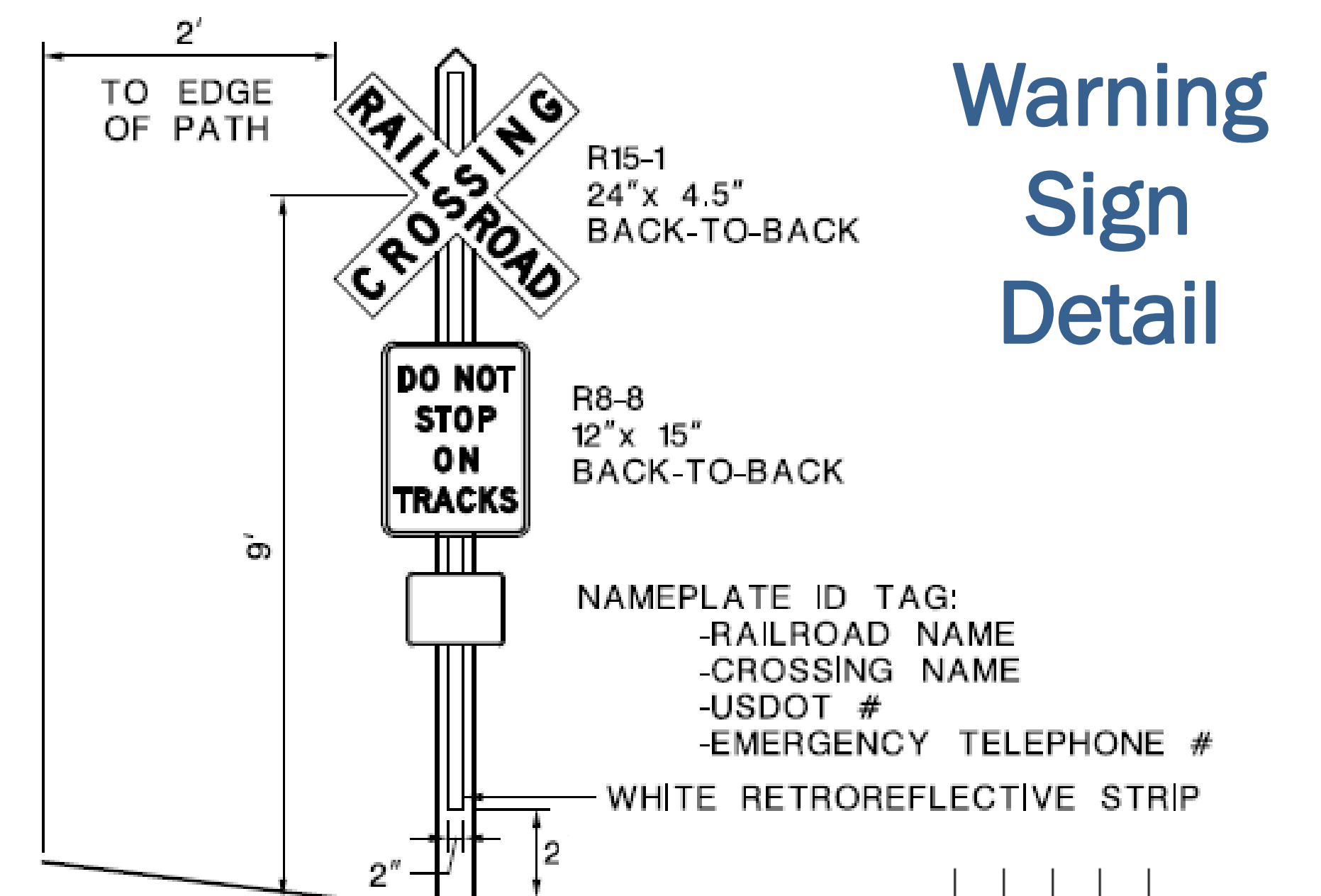
ACTIVE RAIL CROSSING

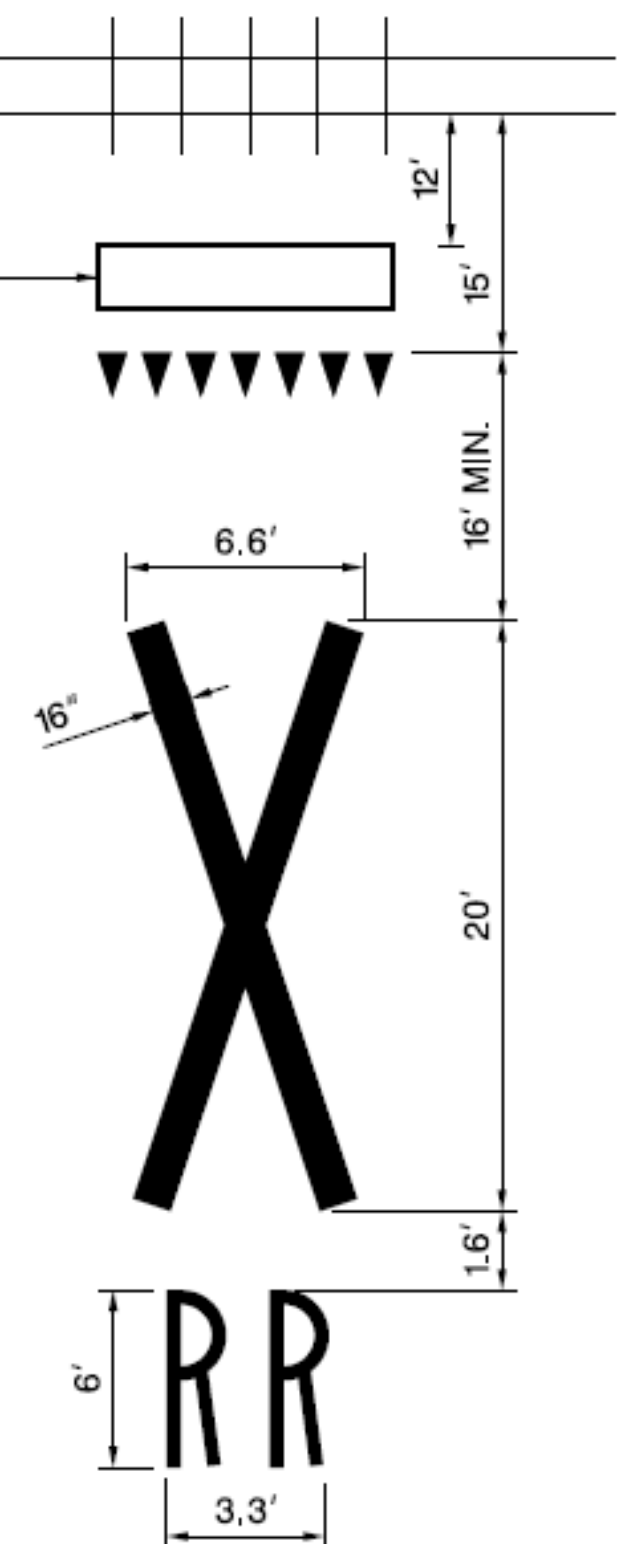


Norfolk Southern Railroad Crossing between Mountain View Boulevard & Meadow Road

Warning Sign Detail

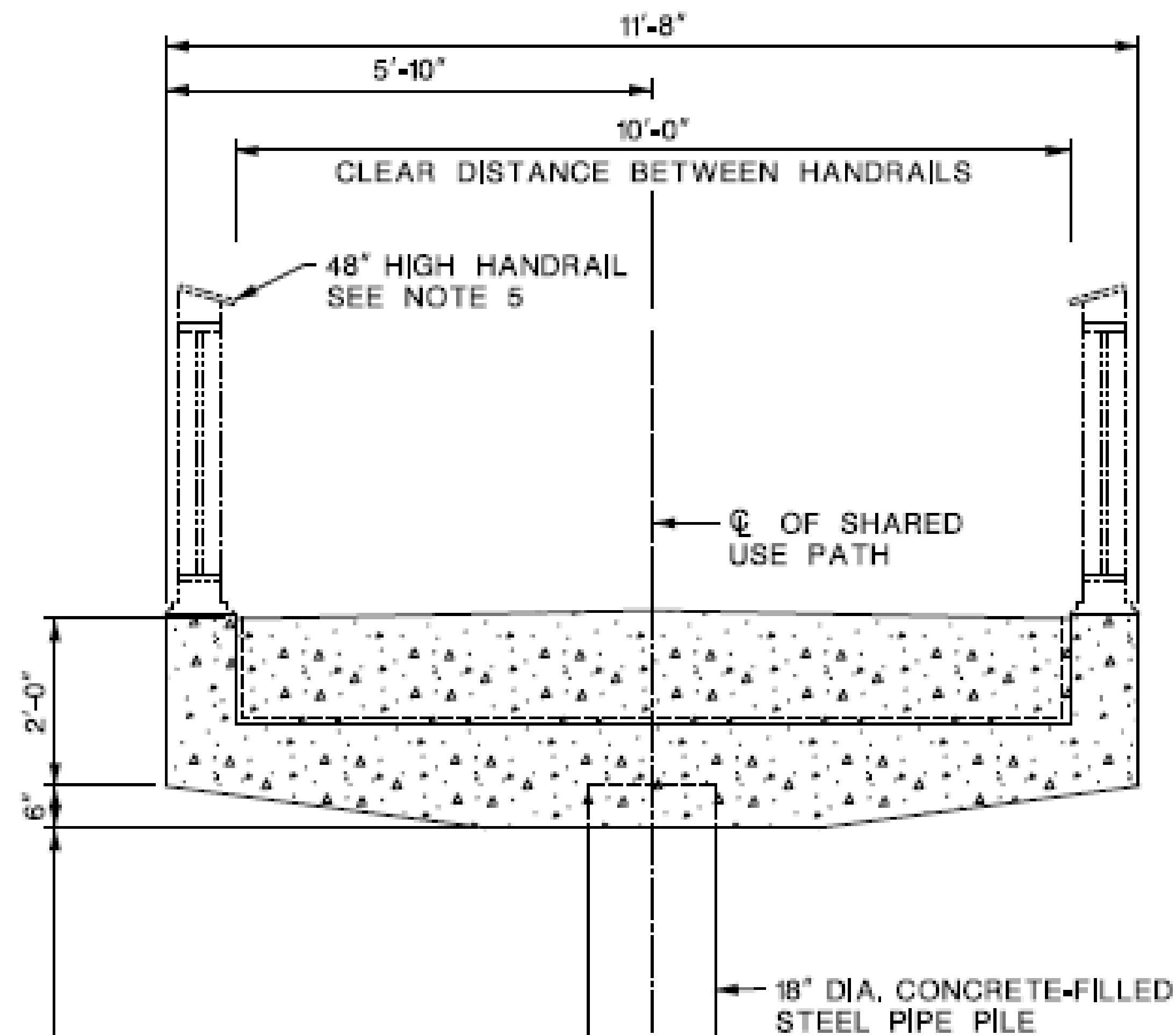


Pavement Markings

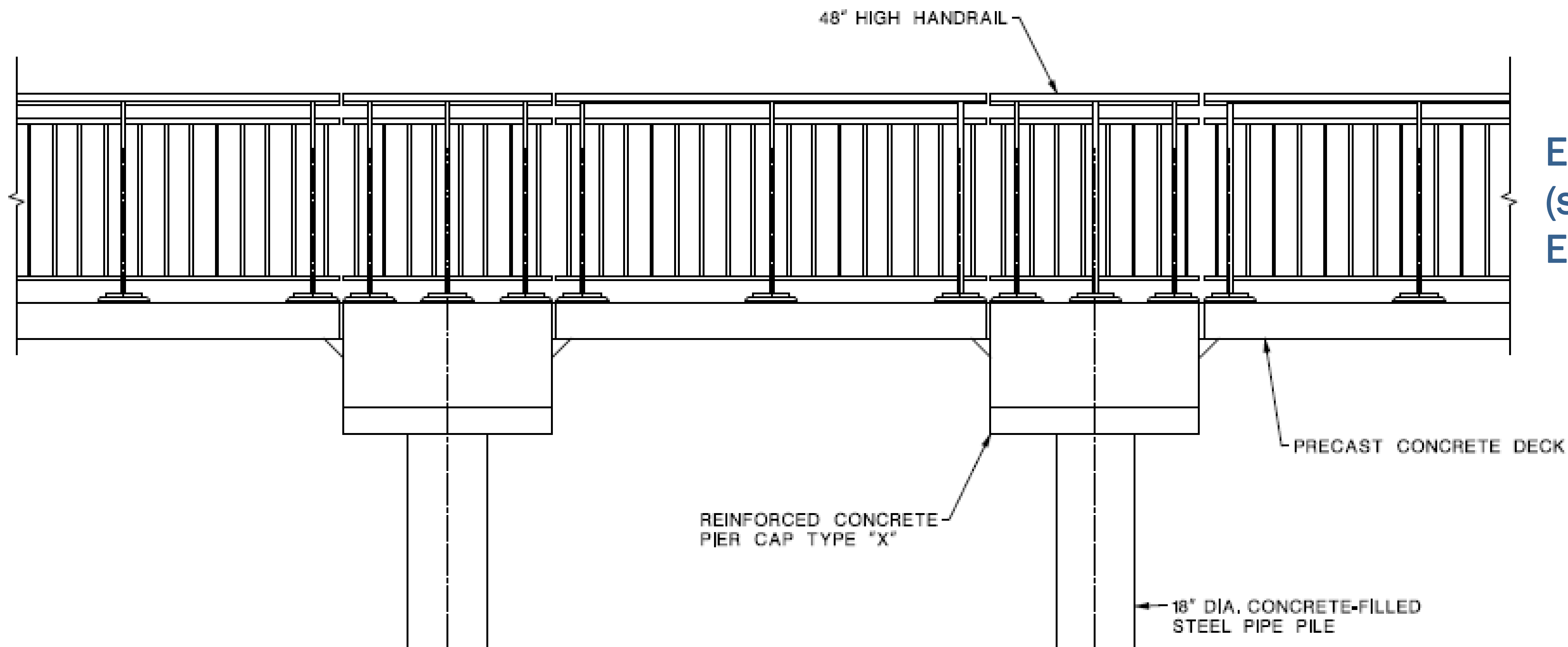


ELEVATED PATH

The Width of the Path will Maintain 10 feet between the Handrails



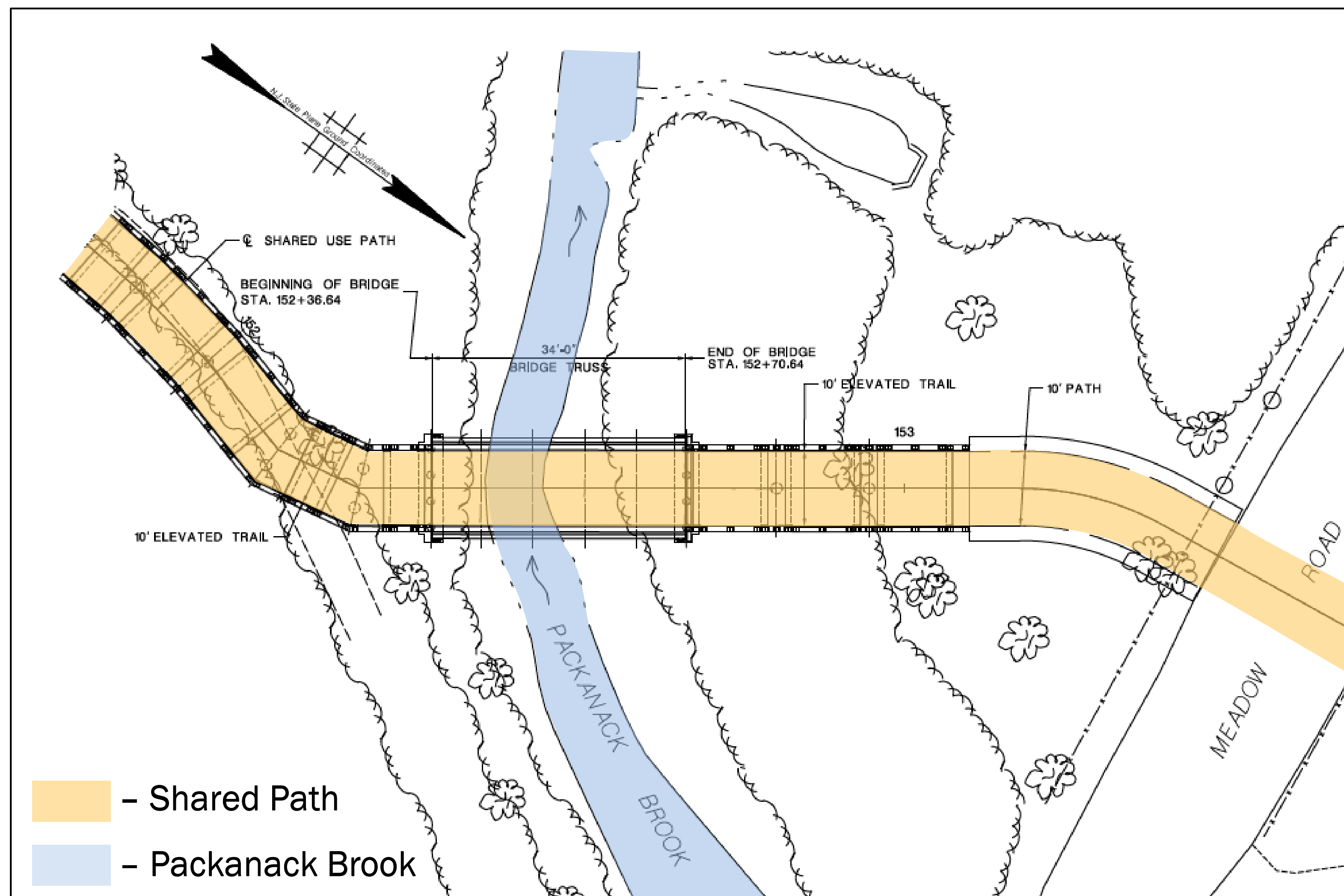
Cross Section

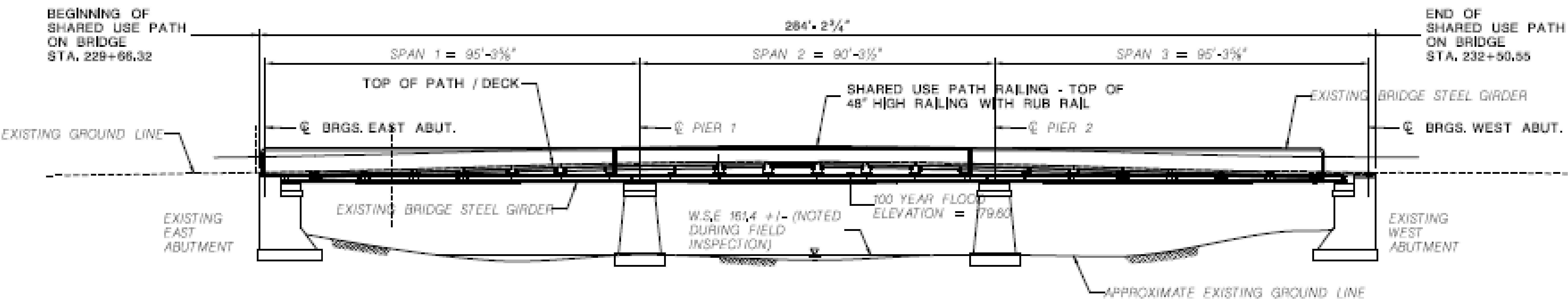
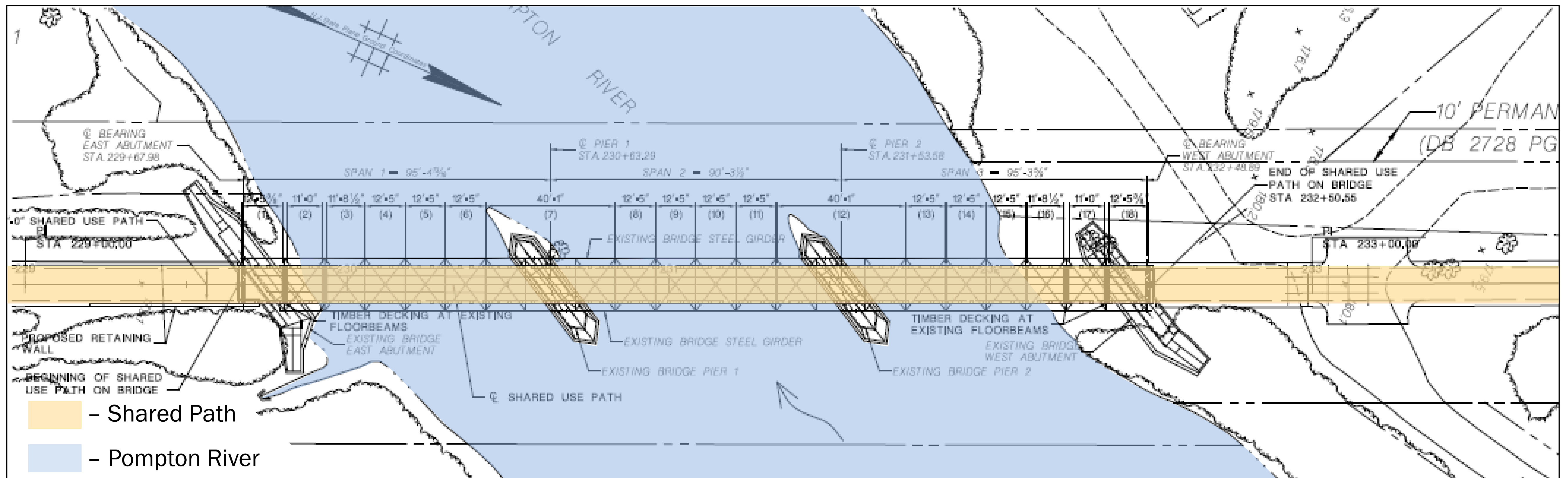

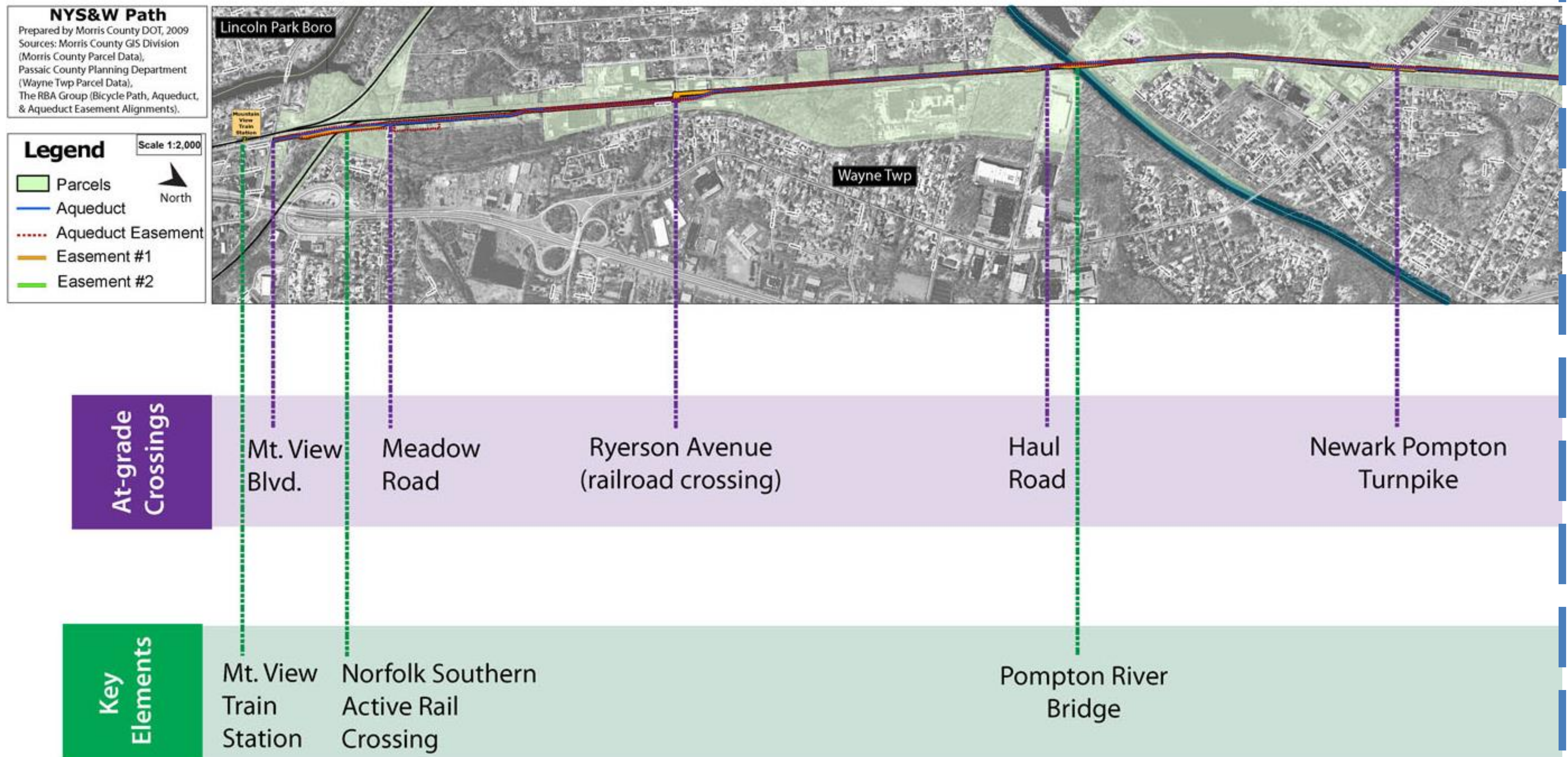

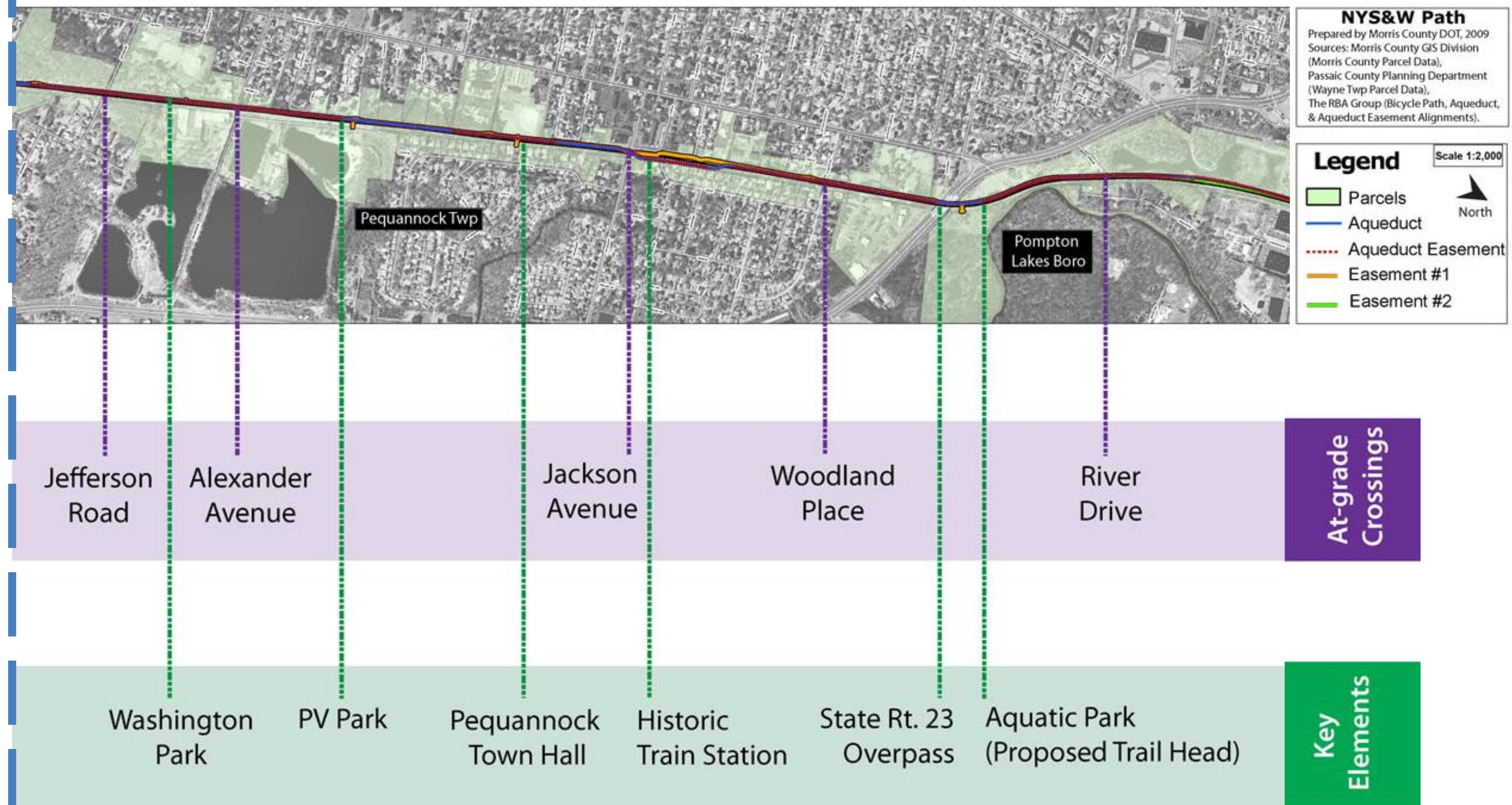
