MORRIS COUNTY DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES

- The Mental Health Addictions Services Advisory Board (MHASAB) reported on the Advisory Leadership Group and the Unified Funding Plan. One of their goals is to keep all more attuned to information about programs and services, which would in turn assist in making determinations in the funding process. For instance, if there is a change in funding criteria in one funding stream, other advisories might be able to review the program for another funding stream. The Leadership Group consists of Chairs/Co-Chairs of all Advisory Boards. By having the Advisory Leadership Group work together, there will be a more formally coordinated cross systems approach. All will become more familiar with the various funding streams in the system. This should help reduce/eliminate fragmentation of services.
- The MHASAB reported that 23rd Consumer and Family Forum will be held on Monday, June 12, 5:30 p.m. to 8:00 p.m., at the Haggerty Center, Frelinghuysen Arboretum, Morristown. The title of the Forum is "Many Faces of Recovery: Celebrate you!" The Forum is a unique opportunity to get a countywide perspective from the individuals we serve regarding our local system of care. - In April, HOPE 1, will begin its first outreach with the goal of engaging hard to reach individuals into recovery services. The person seeking treatment will not get charges if they have contraband. The thought is this van will help link clients to services. The Sheriff's office staffs the vehicle two days a week with plain-clothed police officers, a CARES person and MHA personnel. Other treatment providers are also at the table.
- The Morris County Freeholders passed a Resolution urging the state to put fiscal safeguards in place during the transition to fee for service, or delay the July 1, 2017 implementation date. They asked for the full assurance that agency doors will stay open and current services remain available to New Jersey's most vulnerable residents. They all called upon other counties to join in and insist on these safeguards for our communities.
- The Office on Aging reported that the National Association of Area Agencies on Aging are heavily advocating for replacement of the Affordable Care Act, to insure that older adults, caregivers and people with disabilities continue to receive care.
