Funding Specifications: Grant-in-aid general Human Services funding aims to support individuals and families facing economic, social, and cultural hardships.

All applicants for services must meet the following criteria:

- Be appropriately licensed and maintain the highest standards of quality care.
- Use service outcome measures and performance standards as required.
- Demonstrate an ability to provide and/or refer individuals to a full continuum of care.

*Special Consideration will be given to organizations that provide bi-lingual services (Spanish/English) and provide access to services during untraditional hours (nights, weekends, and holidays).

The target populations for this funding are low-income families and individuals facing economic, social, and cultural hardships.

Funding priorities have been identified through the following:

- Morris County Human Services Planning Documents including:
 - Strategic planning and shared efforts with the Continuum of Care (CoC) to reduce homelessness
 - Consolidated Action Plans from the Morris County Office of Community Development
 - HIV Consumer Consortium Reports
 - HSAC Needs Assessments mandated by NJ Department of Children & Families (DCF)
 - Program monitoring, quarterly reports, and ongoing requests for services
 - United Way's Asset Limited Income Constrained and Employed (ALICE) reports
 - Morris County Advisory Committees/Boards
 - Housing Alliance of Morris County
- Based on this information, the Department of Human Services has prioritized purchasing the following services including, but not limited to:
 - Support services for individuals and families at risk of homelessness, including the following:
 - Emergency Shelter
 - Information and Referral

- Case Management
- Transitional Housing
- Housing Assistance
- Realtor Fees
- Moving Costs (i.e., rental trucks, professional movers, basic household items and furniture)
- Services to promote self-sufficiency in individuals and families, including the following:
 - Training/education
 - Transportation and/or vehicle repairs
 - Employment-related costs
- Child Care Services, including Support Services for parents and parent education programs.
 - Childcare
 - Before/After School Programs
 - Summer Camp
- Developmental and Social Services for at-risk youth, including:
 - Case Management
 - Housing Assistance
- Domestic and Child Abuse Services, including the following:
 - Early intervention to prevent child abuse
 - Crisis intervention
 - Information and referral
 - Shelter
 - Case management
- Status Neutral Services, including the following:
 - Housing services
 - Case management
 - Support Groups
 - Education

The Morris County Human Services Advisory Council will review all 2027 applications. This review will determine 2027 Grant-In-Aid funding recommendations. County Grant-In-Aid will be awarded based on the availability of funds for the calendar year 2027. Should the County receive notification of a reduction in State or Federal funds, 2027 funding may be reduced or terminated. Morris County will not be responsible for replacing or maintaining funding levels if possible, reductions occur in the 2027 allocation process.

The County of Morris reserves the right to renew Subgrant agreements for the period of January 1, 2028, through December 31, 2028, based on annual program review and availability of funding.
