#### **APPROVAL OF MINUTES**

## REPORT OF DIRECTOR & ATTORNEY

Federal Farm and Ranchland Protection Program funding (FRPP) – Ms. Coyle informed the board that representatives from two non-profits had contacted her regarding the availability of FRPP funding. The board discussed the matter and agreed to not accept the funding due to the impervious cover restrictions required by the program. Ms. Coyle explained that there are exemptions to the restrictions, but that the highest allowable impervious cover percentage would be 6% (the standard is 2%)

Soil and Water Conservation Grant Funding – Ms. Coyle and Mr. Lofberg informed the board that the SADC has approximately \$405,000 available for soil and water conservation grants. Grants are available to eligible landowners to fund up to 50% of the costs of approved soil and water conservation projects. Landowners apply directly to local Soil Conservation Districts, which assist in developing farm conservation plans. Farms must be permanently preserved or enrolled in an eight-year preservation program.

## **RIGHT TO FARM**

Stephens Farm – Ms. Coyle informed the board that the SADC was processing the complaint. Information about the voluntary Mediation Program was also supplied to the farmer and the complainant.

#### **CORRESPONDENCE**

There was no correspondence to review.

## **OLD BUSINESS**

Resolution 2010-03: Revised Preliminary Approval – McDermott Farm. Ms. McCulloch informed the board that the preliminary approval resolution had to be revised to include two additional residences in existence on the farm. On motion of member Ort, seconded by member D. Davis, the board adopted Resolution 2010-03. A roll call vote was taken.
