- b. Free tent camping will be available on the evening of Friday May 8th (must supply your own tents)

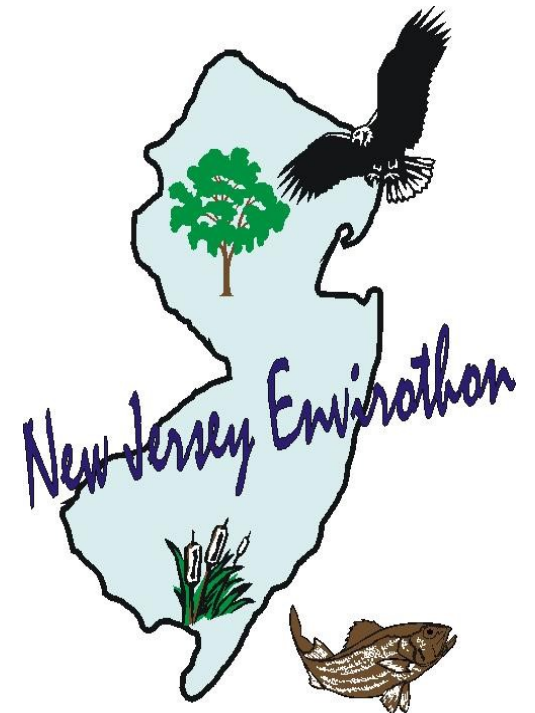
