# Our inventory of responsibility is massive and diverse.


- 287 miles of county roads throughout all Morris County municipalities
- I,000 bridges and culverts throughout all Morris County municipalities
- 3 Freight Railroads
- 1,200 vehicles and pieces of equipment
- 3.4 million square feet of buildings / structures
- Facilities required by the Judiciary, Sheriff, Law and Public Safety
- All trees within the County's road right-of-ways
- Mosquito Control services throughout all Morris County
- 20,437 acres of parkland


The 2024 Capital Plan contains \$2.6 million for intersection improvements including:

- \$850,000 for Ridgedale Avenue and School Avenue in East
   Hanover intersection upgrade and signal replacement
- \$300,000 for Columbia Trail Crossings in Washington Township –
   rapid flashing beacons
- \$850,000 for Guide Rail upgrades and installations throughout the County

# Resurfacing of county roads remains a top priority.


The 2024 Capital Plan contains \$16.5 million for roadway resurfacing of 27 miles in 15 municipalities, including:

- Ridgedale Avenue, East Hanover / Parsippany 4.2 miles Littell Road to New Road
- Green Pond Road, Jefferson and Rockaway Township 2.2 miles Jacobs Road to Route 23
- # Tempe Wick / Glen Alpin Road, Mendhams and Harding 4.7 miles Main Street Mendham Boro to Blue Mill Road
- Schooley's Mountain Road, Washington Township 1.6 miles Mill Road to Springtown Road

# We are continuing to expand opportunities through our schools.

Investment in a new Center for Health Professions Building: \$4.2M in 2024

HVAC upgrades to keep the main Denville campus going strong: \$1M

# There are other notable capital investments planned beyond traditional building upgrades & vehicle replacements.

### **Public Safety**

- Law Enforcement training equipment upgrades
- Electronic evidence storage capacity improvements

### **Human Services**

- Interior upgrades to the newly expanded space to serve our Veterans
- M.A.P.S. and home-delivered meals vehicle replacements

### **Park Safety**

- Dam safety compliance
- Removal of diseased Ash trees





# We continue deliberative investment of American Rescue Plan (ARPA) dollars.

Morris County is permitted to use ARPA funds for county investments at a level reflective of revenues lost during the COVID-19 Pandemic. This strategic investment, covering capital expenses previously planned for 2023, 2024, and 2025, will reduce future borrowing needs.

### A few notable ARPA investments areas:

- \$9M for the Morris County Vocational School District
- \$3.8M for the County Correctional Facility
- \$1.9M for Health & Public Safety
